The Bible Leadership Program is Growing


Teamwork is evident in the Bible Leadership program as two new classes have been added this year. In Xemac/La Perla there previously had been misunderstanding and disunity that prevented having a training class, but a new spirit of cooperation has brought about a class of 30 students, 21 men and 9 women. A class has also begun in Carcha, Coban with 23 students ranging in age from 19 to 65. So thankful for these two new training areas and the participation of these brothers and sisters!

The "traveling seminary" continues in Joyabaj with 17 students who will graduate with a certificate this May. As well, the program in Samococh, Coban continues with 14 students and in Sacoj, Coban, with 22 students. In total, 106 leaders are being strengthened and encouraged in five communities, almost double over last year! We are so thankful for our small team that faithfully travels to each of these communities on a rotation every month.

Aviation Ministry is Growing

Eri Alas has done an amazing job organizing this ministry to be self-sustaining. Paid flights cover the expense for emergency and ministry flights. We have also been bless by the donation of a plane from MAF. God has provided two new volunteer pilots to serve alongside Eri.

Noel Du - Thailand

Mission & Ministry: I am serving alongside missionaries Mak & Narola Sanglir in Nan, Thailand. Our target group is the Hmong people who have a religious heritage of spirit

worship. Our weekly ministry is at Kathy's Home (Pua), a Christian dorm that gives the Hmong children (grades 1-12) a place of stay in town so they can receive higher quality education at the public schools and learn about the Gospel of Christ. We disciple, train up, and care for the children holistically as their "home-away-from-home" during the school year. We teach the Bible, have English nights, and host STM teams who do English Camps and/or VBS with our children. On the weekends, we visit the Hmong villages in the mountains to minister to the churches and families.

The past year: Since launching last July '23, I was at KH for half a year, getting involved in the workings of the daily schedule & ministry, building relationships with the children & houseparents, and going through an online missionary training program with Global Frontier Missions. I moved to Bangkok to study Thai at language school from Feb '24 through Sept. In that time, I reached out to fellow classmates, sharing my story and the Gospel where God opened doors. God blessed me with a vibrant local church community where we mutually encouraged and counseled one another. I will be back at KH full-time this November.

- 1. Pray for Noel's Thai language ability to continue to grow as she transitions back to KH, for a spirit of communication, and for favor among the people. Pray also for perseverance as she continues her online missionary training program, and that it will bear fruit.
- 2. Pray for Noel's continued spiritual formation and experience of God's provision and care through brothers & sisters around the world. Pray for her holistic health (physical, mental-emotional, spiritual, relational) as well as for her loved ones in NYC.
- 3. Pray for God's grace and protection against spiritual warfare, disunity, and other harm that may come against the ministry, villages, and Gospel workers.



SUDAN

The conflict in Sudan is still going on. Many people have fled to neighboring countries. We have lost a lot of those who were involved in our church planting efforts, and twelve house fellowships have had to stop meeting because of the war. We would appreciate your prayers for this situation, and all those believers involved!

Palestinian Refugees in Egypt

Since the beginning of the war between Israel and Palestine, Egypt has been receiving many Palestinian refugees, many of whom have been injured in the conflict. During the past month, 120,000 have arrived in the country.

Some very well known Muslim leaders have been going to the hospital where many of the refugees are treated. These men offer to help with the cost of the treatment if the women will marry them. Many of these refugee women have agreed to marry these community leaders in order to cover their expenses.

One of our ministry teams here went to the same hospital to help, and to share the good news with Palestinian refugees. When B asked one family about their needs and ways that he might help, they told him the cost of their treatment. B was able to pay the medical debt for that family. One of the women of the family, Seham, asked "Do I need to marry you for paying my medical cost?" B said, "No, I'm not asking you to marry me! I just want you to know that Jesus loves you very much, and he is the one providing for your medical bills."

Seham asked, "Why you are helping us? Why are you behaving differently from the Salafi Sheikhs who insist that we marry them before they will help us?" B opened up his Bible to share with the family. They were very interested and asked many questions.

This family brought 88 other families to B for help with their medical needs. This is a great opportunity to bring the love of Christ to the Palestinian refugees in Egypt.

- For our discipleship program for new believers, that God will use this to bless many people.
- For members of our ministry teams; we have two women undergoing cancer treatment. Both are married with preteen children. Please pray for their healing!

At the end of July, our family moved to Nottingham. Although we were anxious, God's guidance has been so real. From the very beginning—finding a meeting place, renting a house, enrolling the children in school and nursery — we experienced His provision at every step. This made us more certain that we are walking in God's will, and our faith has gradually been built up.



However, church planting is truly not easy, especially with three young children. From the beginning of sharing the vision and building a core team, to now, with weekly Sunday service, midweek gatherings, and various visitations, everything had to start from scratch, and we have had to figure things out little by little. While we did gain some experience from previous ministry, we have found that many of the situations we face now cannot simply rely on past experiences. This has made us deeply realize the importance of relying on God. In everything, we can only rely on the Lord, and we can only draw close to Him through prayer.

After nearly two months, our weekly service attendance has stabilized at around 20 adults and 7-8 children. Previously, we didn't have much involvement in Kid's Sunday School ministry, but now, in addition to regular preaching on Sundays, we also take turns leading Sunday School. In fact, many times, making God's Word understandable to children through the same Bible passage is no easier than preparing a message for adults. But we are very grateful that during the preparation process, God often humbles us. Through serving in Sunday School, we continue to experience Him, we also see God's miraculous work in the lives of the children.

- 1. Praise the Lord that Nottingham Chinese Gospel Church has already held several Sunday worship services. The ministry team is gradually taking shape. Pray for the Lord to work, build up co-workers, and build the church for His glory.
- 2. There are many members in the church who are weak physically and spiritually. Pray for the Lord's healing and protection.
- 3. For our monthly preaching and Sunday school ministry, pray that the Lord will grant us His Word. Use us to bless the adults and children in the church to know God more.
- 4. As the University student fresher's season approaches, the church will be launching a series of welcome and outreach activities. Pray for the Lord's guidance, that we may meet those who are seeking, and help them come to know the truth.




Tim and Rosie, Adora & Serena Li

We are very grateful that after stepping out of our comfort zone and responding to the Lord's call to come to Glasgow, we have increasingly felt that the entire harvest field of Scotland is very large. Taking Glasgow as an example, in addition to about 8000-10000 students coming from mainland each year, there are also many settled families. One of the Chinese schools in Glasgow has 63 Mandarin classes, indicating that there are 1000+ school-age children and teenagers who speak Mandarin, and by a conservative estimate, there are also 600+ Mandarin families. At present, throughout Scotland, besides us, there might be only one other church offering Sunday services in Mandarin.

- 1. We give thanks that the GCGC has now held eight Sunday services, the serving team is getting used to the existing routines, and a new community is taking shape.
- 2. Please pray for every Wednesday's video course "Establishing a Harmonious Church Culture." May God work in the hearts of all who attend, fostering humility and an honest confrontation with one's own vulnerabilities, hoping for personal transformation to more closely mirror the likeness of Jesus.
- 3. We are grateful that the Friday night Chinese Alpha Course has been underway for four weeks, regularly drawing in 10-15 attendees, including 4 seekers and 3 Christians currently unaffiliated with a stable church community. May God profoundly work within this space so that all those who seek will indeed find.
- 4. We are approaching an Alpha Weekend on the 25th of May and ask for prayers that all registrants might participate without obstacle and that their hearts would be receptive to repentance and faith in our Lord.
- 5. Please pray for Tim who is tasked with delivering sermons on at least three Sundays a month. Rosie also needs our prayers as she leads a stable group of three families and 6 children in Sunday school almost every week.
- 6. Additionally, please uplift in prayer H, a young working adult who is battling feelings of depression.





Mak and Narola Sanglir: Thailand

The Lord brought 36 children to Kathy's Home this new school year which started in May. They attend 3 schools in our district, kindergarten through grade 12. We count it as a blessing to have this opportunity to teach the word of God during these formative years of these young kids. Please pray with us that they may open their hearts to the Lord as we teach His word. Many of them came from demon worship families, some from broken homes, single mom and in fact two of their parents are the head shaman in their villages. Pastor Suchat from Maesanan was coming faithfully to Kathy's Home to teach Bible to the kids, Monday to Tuesday. Some of you may remember that he was a student at KH since grade 7 and God brought his family for full time ministry back to the village. We sent his family to the New Tribes Bible School, 12 hours west of Nan, close to the border of Myanmar. Before the end of school year in March, Suchat shared with us that him and his wife are praying to help at KH Monday through Friday instead of working in their rice fields which is normal life back in the village. The church was happy to send them with their prayers and blessings as their missionary to KH.

- 1. Pray for more coworkers for Kathy's Home and the Hmong ministry in the villages that they will hear the call of God with commitment to serve the Lord.
- 2. Pray for KH alumni who are serving in the churches, schools and other jobs that they will continue to be a light for Jesus and not compromise with the world.

Missionary serving in Southeast Asia

Recent updates:

- Just had a wonderful two-week ministry trip to the South for several preaching, teaching and meetings.
- Invited to speak in a 50th anniversary mission conference of a Chinese church with about 300 people attended. My topic was on cultures and missions.
- We just launched the Chinese version of the prayer booklet for the Chinese believers praying for the nation and people.

- Pray for the Chinese believers to overcome fears so they can reach out to the majority people.
- Pray for the Lord to release the three strongholds for the majority people, politics strongholds, religious strongholds and cultural strongholds so they have the freedom to hear the good news and to follow Jesus.
- The Chinese believers is able to use the launched prayer booklet praying for the nation and people.
- Pray for my new semester studying which I will continue my research and studies about the local cultures. Please pray for wisdom and strength to continue on this essential part of our works here.

Eileen and Hector Liu Chinese Gospel Broadcasting Center

In the early 70s, Eileen and Hector Liu, professionals working in the United Kingdom, were convicted to bring the gospel to the local Chinese families, with the husbands working in restaurants or grocery stores and the wives sewing in garments

factories or caring for the children at home. Employing audio media tools such as cassette tapes, we recorded the gospel message in their dialects. That enabled even the English-speaking Christians to minister to the older Chinese residents.

Throughout the 80s and 90s, CGBC produced programs and gospel tracts in various Chinese dialects. These were widely used for community outreach, short-term missions of churches, as well as carrier missionaries all over the world. In addition to New York City, we established subcenters in Sydney, Toronto, as well as Vancouver. The programs were also used for local radio broadcast. In addition, we sought to reach elderly long-term care patients in hospitals, illegal immigrants from China in prison or detention centers, and Chinese working on ocean liners and deep sea fishing fleets.

By 1999 we were able to change from cassette tapes to Internet broadcast. The production team moved to Asia to continue our mission in the Mainland and Hong Kong. For the next 20 years we maintained our webcast via CGBC.net from our office in Hong Kong. The Lord surprised us by enabling us to reach out to remote villages, as well as specific people groups such as blind students in special schools and blind graduates working in massage parlours, along with a global audience.

2024 Update

In the summer of 2024, we passed the baton to a group of young workers and returned to New York Long Island. The mission is moving forward thanks to God's grace and their dedication and creativity. Currently we are using YouTube in addition to our webcast CGBC.net.

- 1. The political climate in Hong Kong has changed drastically since 2018 and we needed to make adjustment. Please pray for protection and financial provision for the workers. Give them wisdom and courage to face challenges.
- 2. We are discerning the next step for the structure of CGBC and the website CGBC.net. But our mission is unchanged.
- 3. Praying for Spanish speaking volunteers to join if we are going to have one more broadcast channel online in Spanish.

2024 has been pretty fruitful year of ministry. We were able to have a weekly in-person gatherings at Stony Brook for graduate students this year. The first half of 2024 we focused on our commitments to offer ongoing spiritual care to churches and individuals with retreats (3), leadership development series (4 sets of 4-8 sessions spanning minimum 3 months of growing together) and continuous 1-on-1 individual spiritual care and support (30+ sessions). May Lee, one of the founding members of WOW! entered a new chapter of work. We were delighted and encouraged that OCMers and few sister church members attended WOW!'s Refresh silent retreat to be nourished and deepening their relationship with God.

For the remainder of 2024, we will facilitate two different church conferences for their congregation and leadership team. We will be offering 3 different series of hybrid gatherings of group contemplative listening and spiritual journeying experiences for all who are interested, one of which is a women's only group since there was high interest for this form of intimate gathering. We will make more space for storytelling mode of ministry care with believers who are desiring to understand their identity, purpose and calling in Christ. We are developing a new logo and identity that continues to reflect our founding mission and with the emphasis of inclusiveness to both men and women, so that there won't be mistaken perceptions that WOW!'s mission is only for women.

- 1) WOW! We are continuing to build our organizational capacity and hope to grow our team to reach and serve a wider audience.
- 2) Manni Lee: Family care and support has been more demanding and would like more strength and God's provision to help meet needs. More flexibility in engaging with young adult children so as to continue to walk alongside them with faith, hope and love.
- 3) Erika Lee: We are praying for multiplication of growth in my ministry with WOW! and Jeff's pastoral ministry within the church we serve.



Kenny and Cindy Chau International Students Inc – (ISI) transitioning to Oversea Missionary Fellowship (OMF)

This year's focus has been on discipling and equipping Christian students to be disciples who make disciples. Cindy continues to minister to the spouses and families of international students.
